ESBN Executive Council appointed for 2021-2022

The ESBN Executive Council held its fifth meeting on 22 April 2021. The meeting discussed ESBN strategy and decided on ESBN taskforces for the coming two-year period. A new Council was appointed for a two-year period, with George Lam and David Morris re-appointed as Chair and Vice-Chair for a second two-year term, and three new members welcomed on the council: Esther An, Chief Sustainability Officer, City Developments Limited (CDL), Singapore; Anirban Ghosh, Chief Sustainability Officer, Mahindra Group, India, and Constant van Aerschot, Director, Asia Pacific, World Business Council for Sustainable Development (WBCSD).
